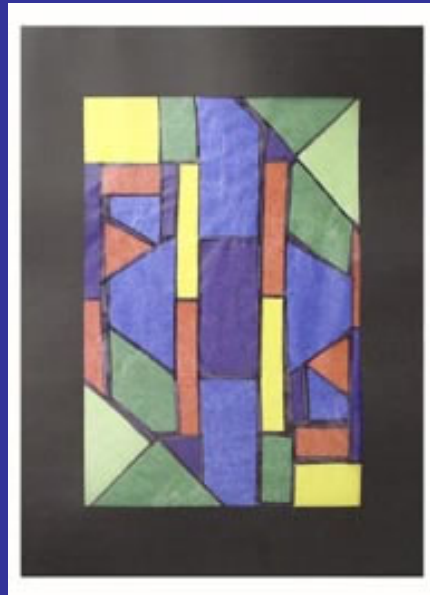


Tissue Stained Glass

Materials Needed:

- * 1 Large [Pre-Cut Mat Frame](#)- Black
- * [Protecto Film™](#)
- * [DecoPuffs®](#)- Assorted
- * Black Marker
- * Scissors
- * Examples of Stained Glass Windows



Objective:

Students will study the lines and colors that make up stained glass by researching stained glass from around the world. They will then create their own stained glass piece by creating a small scale version using protecto film and tissue paper.

Instructions:

- 1. Prep:** Start by laying your pre-cut mat frame in front of you. Cut two pieces of Protecto Film just slightly larger than the middle of the frame.
- 2. Cut and Fit:** Remove the backing to one of the pieces of Protecto Film and lay it sticky side up in front of you. Cut random shapes and colors of DecoPuffs and begin piecing them together like a puzzle until all spaces are filled.
- 3. Outline:** After your entire sheet is filled with color take the other sheet of Protecto Film and stick the two pieces together so that the tissue is in between the 2 sheets. Take a permanent black marker and outline each one of your shapes.
- 4. Frame It:** Take your finished masterpiece and tape it to the back side of the mat frame. Hang it in the window to see the colors come a life.
- 5. Discussion:** Discuss the completed works with you students. Why did they choose the shapes and colors they did? How is paper stained glass different from the real thing? Similar?
